#### **Project Background**

Public library service in Washington County is provided by a partnership between Washington County, nine cities, and three nonprofit organizations (together known as the Cooperative). In February 2024, the County engaged with Merina+Co, a local consulting firm, to conduct an evaluation of the existing Cooperative funding and governance model. ### **Building a Shared Vision for the Ideal Cooperative Model**

WCCLS and partners have the shared desire to address long-standing funding and governance issues, ultimately improving service consistency and equity across the County, and supporting community needs by creating a library system with a fiscally sustainable future. The partners participated in a process for establishing a shared vision for the ideal Cooperative model that will serve as a guidepost while working towards the recommended proposals for funding and governance of the Cooperative.
